Expectations

Child Care Services Taree & Districts Inc. will endeavour to.

- Promote environmentally responsible behaviour and educate on environmental issues among our staff, participants, suppliers, and the community.
- Reduce waste going to the landfill by minimizing amount of waste produced, reusing materials when possible, and recycling other wastes.
- comply with all applicable legislation
- When possible, purchase and use environmentally responsible (recyclable, refurbished, etc.) products from environmentally responsible suppliers (i.e., suppliers who emphasise the need for renewable energy supplies).
- Strive to better understand both the direct and indirect impact that our practices may have on the environment.
- Dispose of waste thoughtfully, and develop an attitude of "reducing, recycling and reusing."

Implementation

By following these 3 rules Child Care Services will implement and actively participate in environmentally responsible behaviors.

Reduce: CCSTD will firstly question whether a purchase is strictly necessary and if it is, whether the amounts required could be reduced.

Re-use: Secondly CCSTD will seek to buy re-used items in preference to new items where practical.

Recycle: If new items have to be purchased, CCSTD will seek whether there is a feasible option of buying products made locally from recycled materials or a more energy efficient model.
